Rhonda Larson & VENTUS Take Belarusians on Music Travel Through Time and Space

On their visit to Belarus on October 9-13, 2011 U.S. Grammy-winning flutist Rhonda Larson and her band VENTUS performed their beloved genre of world music with exceptional passion and musicianship. The Teacher Training Branch of the Music Academy in the city of Mogilev hosted a solo performance by Ms. Larson, entitled "One Woman, a World of Music." The show, followed by a stimulating Q&A session, brought together over 300 music students and faculty, who truly appreciated this unique cultural exposure.
